POWs in Laos

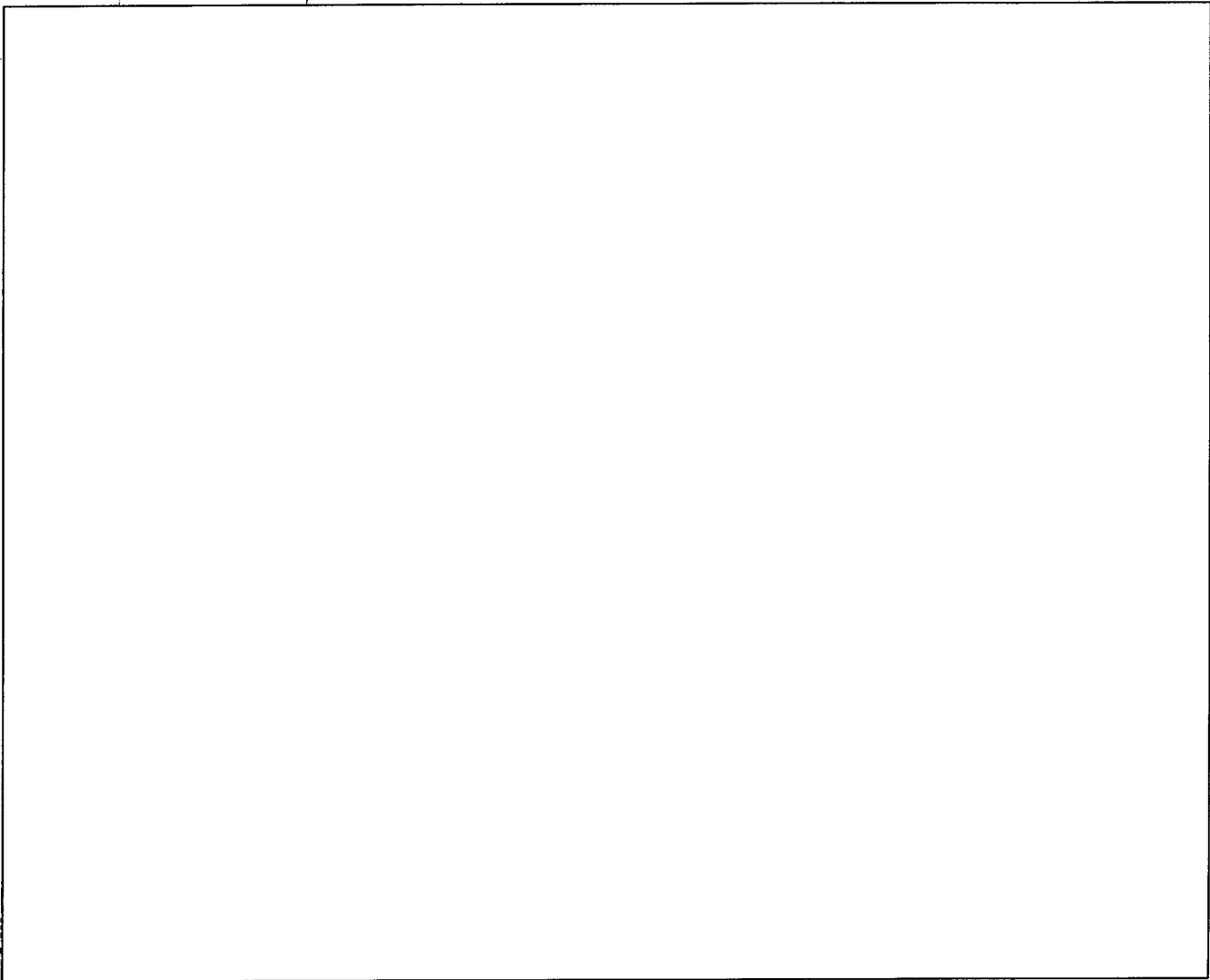
The [redacted] has been told by the Pathet Lao that US prisoners of war in Laos will be released by the Lao Communists in Laos and not by the North Vietnamese in Hanoi. A Communist official in Vientiane, acting under orders from his headquarters in Sam Neua, said on 17 March that the US had already been informed of the names and numbers of US prisoners in Laos--apparently a reference to the list released by North Vietnam in January. He added that these prisoners would be released under procedures that will be set forth in the military protocol currently being negotiated in Vientiane. [redacted]
