CONSENT MOTION TO ENLARGE TIME TO FILE DEFENDANT'S MOTION FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT

Defendant, the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), respectfully moves the Court for a moderate enlargement of time to its motion for summary judgment. Defendant request a 20-day extension, through and including July 13, 2016. In support of its motion, defendant states as follows.

- CIA's motion for summary judgment is currently due on June 23, 2016. Its
 declaration is largely complete; this extension is due to massive conflicts in
 undersigned counsel's schedule.
- 2. Since the beginning of June, undersigned counsel has been responsible for drafting four substantial filings in other matters. These include: (i) and (ii) two motions for summary judgment in *Pinson v. DOJ*, No. 12-1872 (CRC) (filed June 1 and June 10); (ii) defendant's Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in *SD3 v. Lee*, No. 08-1242 (RCL) (filed June 13); and (iii) defendant's motion for summary judgment in *Hicklin v. McDonald*, No. 14-1569 (CRC) (filed June 15).

- 3. On June 23, the day the CIA's motion is due in this case, undersigned counsel also has a summary judgment motion due *Smith v. Contreras-Sweet*, No. 15-472 (CRC), a complex Title VII matter.
- 4. Complicating matters yet further, Magistrate Judge Kay recently selected June 22

 i.e., the day before the summary judgment motions are due for mediation in
 Gaskins v. United States, No. 14-1208 (APM). This was not a date selected in advance by the parties.
- 5. Although only a brief enlargement beyond June 23 would be necessary, undersigned counsel will be out of the country from June 24 through July 6. The requested enlargement extends only a week past July 6.
- 6. Plaintiffs' counsel has consented to the requested relief.

For the foregoing reasons, defendant respectfully requests a 20-day enlargement of time, through and including July 13, to file its motion for summary judgment. A proposed order is attached that extends the opposition and reply deadlines by equal periods.
