

Dear Mssrs. Lesar and Clarke:

This is in response to your request under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) dated 7 February 2003. In response to the portion of Item #6 of your request that seeks records relating to the assessment of fees, the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) has conducted a diligent search of relevant systems of records that was reasonably calculated to discover any responsive records. Pursuant to that search, the CIA has identified two responsive records, copies of which are attached.

The two responsive documents contain information that is protected from disclosure by section 6 of the Central Intelligence Agency Act of 1949, 50 U.S.C.A. § 403(g) (West Supp. 2004), and thus, such information is properly redacted under FOIA Exemption (b) (3).



Enclosed are the majority of the documents you selected consisting of 183 pages of material. Since you are entitled to the first 100 pages free of charge as a requester in the "all other" category, the total cost to you with respect to this material is \$8.30. Please be advised that the following two documents are unavailable at this time because they are currently elsewhere being converted into microfiche. Once these documents are returned to us, we will provide you with copies. The documents currently being microfiched are as follows:

With respect to your 7 February 1994 letter, as we advised you in paragraph 4 of our 13 January 1994 letter, the Department of Defense (DOD) has the primary responsibility for POW/MIA matters. Therefore, you should submit your request directly to DOD.


With respect to the overall subject of your request and any other information you may need regarding POW/MIAs, please refer to paragraphs 3 and 4 of our 13 January 1994 letter regarding your 5 January 1994 FOIA request for records pertaining to POWs.

In addition, with respect to that portion of your letter requesting "information from all sources and SOG-80, JCS, controlled american source, NSA," please be advised that we are not authorized to release other government agency information. Further, it is your responsibility to submit your requests to the originating agencies.

And finally, with respect to your request for a fee waiver, since the material listed on the machine printouts has been previously released in the public domain, its re-release would not contribute significantly to the public understanding of the operations and activities of the United States Government. Accordingly, your request for a fee waiver is denied and you will be required to pay reproduction costs as described above.

We regret we are unable to assist you further and trust that the information provided will assist you in your endeavors.
